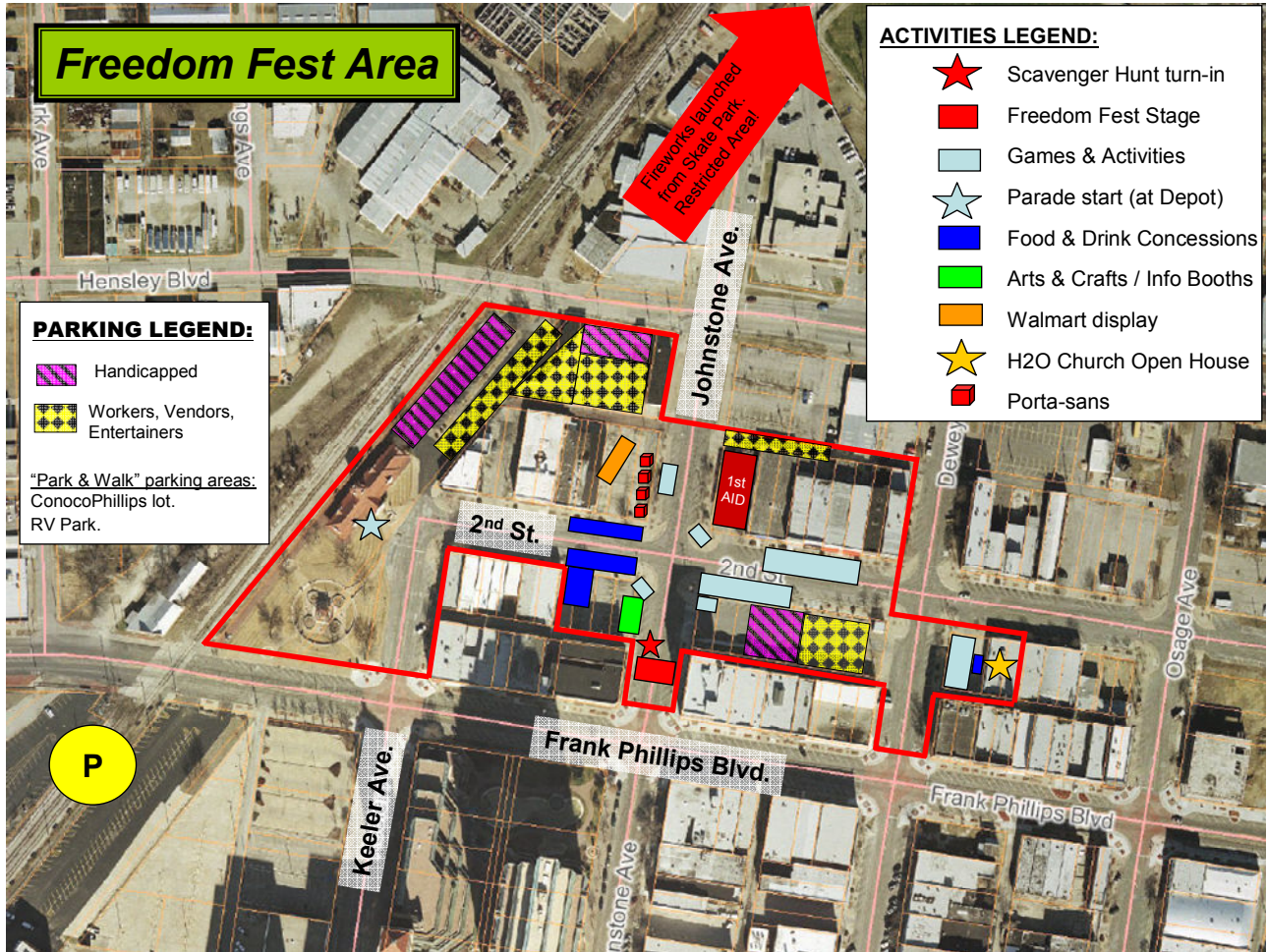

Want to sponsor an activity but need some ideas?

We've got a million of 'em!

Add a Freedom Fest patriotic theme to make it even more festive.

Make up your own rules, or ask us for ours. A great way to get some exposure for your organization, do some community service, and have fun at the same time.

Face painting. Kids love it – and even some grown-ups can't resist! It can also be a great fundraising project for your organization.

Turtle Races. Old timers will remember this fun activity from their youth. Mark out a big circle, let your contestants pick a turtle from the "pond", place them in the middle of the circle, and the fun begins! Whichever turtle gets outside the circle first wins!

Cake Walk. Another old time favorite. Similar to "Musical Chairs", contestants walk in a "numbered" circle until the music stops. If their number is drawn, they win!

Hula Hoop contest. Everyone one knows how this works!

Washer Toss. We already have the equipment. All you need to do is provide the volunteers to man the booth!

Water Melon Eating Contest. Nothing says "Fourth of July" better than eating watermelon. And how much more fun is it when you're racing to eat it faster than your competitors.

Sidewalk Chalk Art. Give a kid a stick of colored chalk and a blank sidewalk, and let the fun begin. Make it a competition, or just a nice way for mom and dad to rest their feet the kiddos expend some energy.

Water Balloon Toss. A cool twist on the old favorite Egg Toss. Not quite as messy and whole lot nicer on a hot day.

Bean Bag Toss. We already have the equipment for this game, too. Just add volunteers for a ready-made activity.

Basketball Toss. Have a portable basket? Then you're ready to go with an activity everyone loves. Or try some variations using Frisbees and auto tires.

Can "Knock Down". Stack the cans up high and have participants knock 'em down.

Ping-Pong Target Game. Place ping pong balls on top of pop bottles, and shoot them off with water squirt guns.

Limbo Contest. How low can you go? Lots of fun for any age.

Pin the Hat on Uncle Sam. Just like "Pin the Tail on the Donkey".
